TLC Tips – Staying Ready for Transplant Evaluation

- Keep an updated medication list and your transplant coordinator's contact information easily accessible.
- Complete labs on schedule - your MELD score updates automatically with each new set of results.
- Notify your care team promptly about any hospitalizations or major health changes.
- Attend transplant education sessions when available to better understand the process.
- Ask your team about living-donor options and evaluation pathways when appropriate.

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
