

Vaccination Guidelines & Clinic Locations

About This Resource

Vaccines are a vital part of protecting people with liver disease. They reduce the risk of severe infections that can worsen liver injury or interfere with treatment and transplant eligibility. Texas Liver Care currently provides vaccine review and coordination ensuring each patient's immunization plan is complete and documented with their primary-care or pharmacy provider.

Key Vaccines for Liver Health

- Hepatitis A & B Vaccines – Strongly recommended for all patients with chronic liver disease.
- Influenza Vaccine – Annual vaccination for infection prevention.
- Pneumococcal Vaccine (PCV20 / PPSV23) – Protects against pneumonia and bloodstream infections.
- Tdap & Shingles Vaccines – Routine adult updates as indicated by age and immune status.

TLC Tips – Staying Protected

- Bring your vaccine record to every visit for updates.
- Tell your provider if you use immunosuppressive medications.
- Avoid live vaccines if you are post-transplant or severely immunocompromised.
- Get Hepatitis A and B vaccines as soon as feasible after diagnosis of liver disease.
